The award is a bronze medallion designed by the renowned artist Elizabeth Holbrook, mounted on a plaque for presentation at an awards reception hosted by the Hamilton Mundialization Committee.

The way to resolve international disputes is through world law rather than by force, and supports the efforts of the United Nations in seeking solutions to world conflicts.

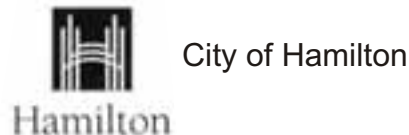
World Citizenship recognizes the necessity for Canadians to become knowledgeable about and sensitive to people of other cultures if racial discrimination is to be eradicated.
